Florida LLC Formation Checklist

Step 1: Name Your Florida LLC

The name of your Florida LLC should be distinguishable from other business names in your state and must meet the Florida naming guidelines.

How to Complete This Step:

Review Florida's naming guidelines

- Your name must include the phrase "limited liability company" or one of its abbreviations (LLC or L.L.C.).
- Your name cannot contain language implying that the LLC is organized for an unlawful purpose or one not stated in its articles of organization.
- Your name cannot contain language implying that the LLC is connected with a state or federal government agency or corporation.
- In some states, certain restricted words (Bank, Attorney, University, etc.) may require additional paperwork and a licensed individual to be part of your LLC.
- Your name must be distinguishable from any existing business in the state, except for certain fictitious name registrations, general partnership registrations, and limited liability partnership statements.

Step 2: Choose a Registered Agent

A <u>registered agent</u> is the person or company you choose to accept official communication on behalf of your LLC.

Your registered agent must be:

- 18 years or older
- · A resident of Florida
- Available at all times during normal business hours (i.e., 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday through Friday) at their listed physical address (no P.O. boxes)

Many businesses choose to use a <u>registered agent service</u> for convenience and privacy.

Step 3: File Your Articles of Organization

The Articles of Organization is the paperwork required to register your LLC. This document is filed with the Department of State either <u>online</u> or by <u>mail</u>.

You will need to provide the following information:

- Name of the LLC (Step 1)
- · Principal business address
- · Name and address of the registered agent (Step 2)
- · Names and addresses of managers
- · Effective date

This is also a good time to decide if your LLC will be member-managed or manager-managed.

A member-managed LLC structure is when the members of the LLC are involved with the management of the LLC. A manager-managed LLC is when a few assigned individuals are responsible for managing the LLC.

Step 4: Create an Operating Agreement

An operating agreement lays out the rules and management structure of your LLC.

Your operating agreement doesn't need to be filed with the state. You'll keep it in your LLC records file and return to it as needed to clarify rules and settle disputes.

Step 5: Get an EIN

An Employer Identification Number (EIN) is like a Social Security number for your business. EINs are free and easy to get from the IRS using Form SS-4 or by filling out the online application.
