

Idaho LLC Formation Checklist

Step 1: Name Your Idaho LLC

The name of your Idaho LLC should be distinguishable from other business names in your state and must meet the Idaho naming guidelines.

How to Complete This Step:

Review Idaho's naming guidelines

- Your name must contain one of the following terms or abbreviations: limited liability company, limited company, L.L.C., LLC, L.C., or LC. "Limited" may be abbreviated as "Ltd.," and "company" may be abbreviated as "Co."
- If the LLC is a professional entity (such as a law firm), the name may include the word "professional" before the word "limited" or the letter "P" at the beginning of any of the permitted abbreviations.
- Your name cannot contain language falsely stating or implying government affiliation.
- Many states have restricted words (such as "bank") that may require approval to be used in business names.
- Your name must be distinguishable from any existing business registered with the Idaho Secretary of State.

Step 2: Choose a Registered Agent

A [registered agent](#) is the person or company you choose to accept official communication on behalf of your LLC.

Your registered agent must be:

- 18 years or older
- A resident of Idaho
- Available at all times during normal business hours (i.e., 9 a.m.–5 p.m. Monday through Friday) at their listed physical address (no P.O. boxes)

Many businesses choose to use a [registered agent service](#) for convenience and privacy.

Step 3: File Your Certificate of Organization

The Certificate of Organization is the paperwork required to register your LLC. This document is filed with the Secretary of State either [online](#), by [mail](#), or in person.

You will need to provide the following information:

- Name of the LLC (Step 1)
- Principal business address
- Mailing address
- Name and address of the registered agent (Step 2)
- Name and address of at least one governor of the LLC

This is also a good time to decide if your LLC will be [member-managed or manager-managed](#).

A member-managed LLC structure is when the members of the LLC are involved with the management of the LLC. A manager-managed LLC is when a few assigned individuals are responsible for managing the LLC.

Step 4: Create an Operating Agreement

An [operating agreement](#) lays out the rules and management structure of your LLC.

Your operating agreement doesn't need to be filed with the state. You'll keep it in your LLC records file and return to it as needed to clarify rules and settle disputes.

Step 5: Get an EIN

An Employer Identification Number ([EIN](#)) is like a Social Security number for your business. EINs are free and easy to get from the IRS using [Form SS-4](#) or by filling out the [online application](#).
